How would you invest a \$25,000 lump sum if you were given it tomorrow?

I'd invest in an expansion of our portion plate range to include a porcelain bowl, so you can cook your porridge in the microwave.

How do you feel about investing overseas?

I like the idea but have not taken serious steps.

How well do you treat your credit card?

I pay it off fully monthly, both business and personal.

How do you feel about life and disability insurance?
